GREETINGS FROM BOARD MEMBER NANCY BUSS



Music was a big part of my life in my early years, with piano lessons in elementary and high school and a major in music in college. I didn't know about the recorder until later, however, when my husband brought back a soprano from a trip he had taken.

Even then I didn't play for several years, until I started teaching music in a small parochial school. I kept one lesson ahead of the students that first year, but we all learned. Eventually, as part of a master's program in music education, I wrote my own instruction book (with many lacks since I was self-taught).

Playing in a group didn't happen until the end of my first year of teaching, when I met Mila Adler, a longtime recorder player and teacher in the Chicago (IL) area who had recently moved to Atlanta (GA) and was looking for players to meet weekly at her home. What fun!

My first acquaintance with ARS was several years later. Mila persuaded me to join her for a weeklong recorder workshop, which was my first experience playing in a large group. What a unique sound and wonderful comradery!

Not long after that, Mila started talking about having an ARS chapter in Atlanta, and we asked, "What's ARS?" She got the charter for our Atlanta chapter in 1981 and proved that the organization really is worthwhile and beneficial. She helped organize and lead several daylong workshops during the 1980s and led a quartet of players to Austria for a memorable week of study with Hans Ulrich Staeps in 1984.

For 35 years I have had the privilege of teaching a number of individuals and leading small groups. Currently I have four seniors as students and lead Emily's Consort (named for Mila Adler, who started the group in 1985).

Through the years I have learned from a number of teachers at various workshops and have been particularly enthusiastic about those at ARS-sponsored workshops. Every new thing I learn makes me a better player and teacher.

As an ARS Board member, I hope to help make this organization stronger and to have an impact on the lives of more players and listeners, as folks are attracted to and enchanted by this most marvelous of instruments.

It was gratifying to see so many qualified applicants this year. We hope that the scholarship recipients had an enjoyable and enriching workshop experience.

Funding for this year's scholarships came from the Andrew Acs, Jennifer Wedgwood Lehmann and Daniel J. Morris Memorial funds, and the General Scholarship Fund. These were established over the years though generous donations in order to support workshop attendance by recorder players of all ages and abilities.

GRANTS AWARDED

American Recorder Society is pleased to announce several recent grants.

Les Bois (ID) Chapter, led by Kim Wardwell, received a \$300 Chapter Grant. They also received a small additional Educational Outreach Grant. These funds came from the Daniel Morris Fund. Their project is to build a recorder program in Boise high schools and provide a SATB set of recorders for students.

A small grant from the DeMarsh Fund was made to **Hathaway Brown School** in Shaker Heights, OH, to help a student recorder consort go to Germany and Austria. The 19 girls will create a music and cultural exchange as well as have first-hand experience with music history in performing music in the places where it was composed. Their music teacher is ARS member Deborah Southard.

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
Legacies/Bequests Katz Fund - In Memory of Eugene Reichenthal* Recorder Orchestra of New York Recorder Society of Long Island

BOARD MEETS IN DENVER, CO

The Fall Board meeting was held at Regis University in Denver, CO, September 15-18, 2011. Our hosts were the Denver Chapter, who showed us marvelous hospitality at our Thursday night reception, and some great music at the Friday night chapter meeting and potluck dinner. We were entertained by StopTime, a Denver-based jazz group of recorders, vocalists, percussion and rhythm section.

One of our first orders of business was to appoint Ann Stickney as Treasurer, replacing Cathy Emptage who had served for almost three years in that position before recently resigning. Thanks to Cathy for her service, and we welcome Ann back to the Board!



Some important actions or decisions that were made include:

- Changing the frequency of American Recorder magazine from five issues per year to four, effective in September
- Some very exciting steps toward securing the ARS's financial stability, including establishment of an Endowment Fund, a Legacy Circle for bequests, and modernizing our capabilities for taking payments and donations
- Establishment of a Publications Committee, to oversee the publications of ARS, ensuring consistency and coordination of all print and digital media
- Refocusing efforts on supporting the members of ARS, and seriously weighing every expenditure that falls outside that focus (such as funding a booth at festivals such as Berkeley and Boston)
- Rewriting and refining job descriptions of all the Board positions, so that any potential candidates for the Board will have a much clearer idea of what they might be getting into!

Regis is also the site of the Recorder Music Center (RMC), headed by Mark Davenport. The Board enjoyed a behind-the-scenes tour of the RMC, which is the repository for all the archives and historical papers of ARS. Besides a large and growing collection of recorder music, the RMC's holdings include lots of original materials from the earliest chapters, cool old photographs, and much more. As the 75th anniversary of ARS approaches, coinciding with the 10th anniversary of the RMC, look for some fascinating information to emerge!

Thanks from the Board of Directors to the members of the Denver Chapter for hosting us, to Regis University for providing our meeting space, and the Recorder Music Center for providing lunch one day! This was a most enjoyable and productive meeting.
